Daily/regular homework tasks: *Work on rapid recall of number bonds/facts up to 20 (addition and subtraction). *Learn time tables. Start with solving them and once confident move onto rapid recall of the facts. *Reading at home. Read with your child and talk about the text. *Work on reading and spelling numbers to twenty, days of the week and months of the year. *Work on reading and spelling the Common Exception Words. *Work on reading the words in the Sight Word Book. *Weekly book reviews.
